Unhurried seasons of united prayer and fellowship with the pastor of the assembly and members of his household, both morning and afternoon were not without fruit; for streams of grace flowed over the people. Hearts were melted. Some saw their faults. Confessions followed. The atmosphere in the meeting quickly changed and seemed heavenly.

Under the ministry of God's holy Word, night after night, both believers and unbelievers were under conviction, the former to feel their need of a closer walk with God and the latter to recognize the necessity of assurance of sins forgiven. Truly the holding up of a scriptural standard of spiritual attainment and living is helpful to conviction. The spirit of contrition and yieldedness rested upon the people. Nearly all the unsaved in attendance and those as yet not baptized in the Spirit came to the altar, twelve, fifteen or twenty at a single service. Several were saved or baptized in the Spirit while others are still tarrying.

The necessity of living in the Spirit and preparing for the translation-preparation, too, to meet the difficult days just ahead, was constantly emphasized.

One night the prophetic Word came forth through a brother, calling for confession. Several started to justify themselves and find fault with others. They were told that this was a confession meeting. One sister said she felt hurt at being stopped, adding she had never before been at such a meeting. Alas! confession meetings in some localities have been so conducted as to give occasion to relate the faults of others!

Nothing could be more disastrous to spirituality and gratifying to the flesh than such a procedure. One night a spirit of prayer fell upon the people. Almost the whole service was given to prayer, which was very earnest and spiritual.

Two couples who had separated and were about to seek a divorce were blessed with a touch of God and were reunited in the Lord.

The application of the truth unfolded in the tract, "The Law of Heredity Reversed," through prayer, wrought a signal deliverance and transformation in the dispositions of a few, and in a remarkable way.

A two-year-old child habitually resented her mother's correction by striking at her in a spiteful manner. When the evil spirit was cast out of the child, she was wonderfully changed and made docile.
