"The day of the Lord," or "day of Jehovah," sometimes called "that day," is a period of time often described by the prophets. It is made to appear as a terrible day of God's fiery fury and cruel wrath and indignation. Jehovah has borne long with the awful crimes and wickedness of mankind. But prophetic writers have pointed to a time of retribution. We quote some of these warnings.

"The day of the Lord is near upon all the heathen." "The indignation is upon all nations." "The Lord cometh out of His place to punish the inhabitants of the earth." "The Lord has a controversy with the nations." "The slain of the Lord shall be from one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth." "A great slaughter." Obadiah 15; Isa. 34:2-8; 26:20,21; Jer. 25:30-33.

"Behold, the day of the Lord cometh, cruel both with wrath and fierce anger." "And I will punish the world for their evil, and the wicked for their iniquity." "Howl ye, for the day of the Lord is at hand." "It shall be the time of the heathen." "For behold, the Lord will come with fire and with His chariots like a whirlwind, to render His anger with fury, and His rebuke with flames of fire. For by fire and by His sword will the Lord plead with all flesh, and the slain of the Lord shall be many." "The great day of the Lord is near." "That day is a day of wrath, a day of trouble and distress, a day of wasteness and desolation, a day of darkness and gloominess, a day of clouds and thick darkness." Isa. 13:6-13; 66:15,16; Ezek. 30:1-3; Zeph. 1:14,15.

"Neither their silver nor their gold shall be able to deliver them in the day of the Lord's wrath; but the whole land shall be devoured by the fire of His jealousy: for He shall make even a speedy riddance of all them that dwell in the land." "To lay the land desolate: and He shall destroy the sinners thereof out of it." Zeph. 1:18; Isa. 13:9.

Hereby we see this great and terrible day of His wrath, a period of time in which the pent up treasures of wrath (Rom. 2:5) that have for a long time smoldered, break forth upon a wicked world in fiery fury.

The vast extent of this cataclysm of the day of God's wrath and its awful destruction is not fully realized. Read the description in Isaiah 24 where it is largely described. "Behold, the

Lord maketh the earth empty, and maketh waste and turneth it upside down." "The shall be utterly emptied and utterly spoiled It is the Lord's purpose to clear the world sinners, sin, wickedness, man's government nations, human religions, organizations, inst tutions, heathendom, civilization so-called all the ungodly works of men, and everything that fortifies against the power and program God-the Gentile image broken into chaff before the wind.

As the day of the Lord is connected with the close of the Gentile Rule and Israel's pu ishment, its time should be now. The late Mrs t Rosenkrans of Rochester, who received a beau tiful gift of prophecy, was given to say in the fall of 1931: "The dew is on the grass; the day a of the Lord is dawning." Repeated summer 1932. At a meeting on Labor Day, Sept. 2, 198 [an interpretation by one who was deeply anoint o ed was given at Lebanon, N. J., in which it was b said, "The day of the Lord is here, the day of b the Lord is here." I was greatly startled and t gave a stirring exhortation.

We have frequently repeated this interpreta a tion, while listeners asserted, "I believe it." no "The great day of His wrath is come; and who be shall be able to stand?" Rev. 6:17.

"moved by the Holy Spirit."

Hosea 6:5 tells us this was the means by which God hewed out and slew in ancient times. The prophets from Isaiah to Malachi, inclusive were largely occupied with these governmental judgement prophecies against the nations of those days. Long ago they were fulfilled by the destruction of those nations. trophies and blotting out of those ancient kingdoms were by the "determinate counsel
